
APHORISMS

Lethe River - - in Greek mythology a river in Hades; that the souls of the dead had to drink from, which made them forget all they had done and suffered when they were alive.


mobius strip - an object with one surface and two edges. You can make one by taking a strip of paper, rotating it one time and attaching the ends.

Nevertheless here are some of the standout figures as provided by Daily Kos/Research 2000:

- 31 percent of Republicans believe Obama is a "Racist who hates White people"
- -- the description once adopted by Fox News's Glenn Beck. 33 percent were not sure, and 36 percent said he was not a racist.
- 63 percent of Republicans think Obama is a socialist, 16 percent are not sure, 21 percent say he is not
- -24 percent of Republicans believe Obama wants "the terrorists to win," 33 percent aren't sure, 43 percent said he did not want the terrorist to win.
- 21 percent of Republicans believe ACORN stole the 2008 election, 55 percent are not sure, 24 percent said the community organizing group did not steal the election.
- 23 percent of Republicans believe that their state should secede from the United States, 19 percent aren't sure, 58 percent said no.
- 53 percent of Republicans said they believe Sarah Palin is more qualified to be president than Obama.

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Go Apple: as of Jan 2010 Apple has sold some 250,000,000 iPods / had 50,000,000 visitors to Apple retail stores in the previous holiday quarter / offers 140,000 iPhone applications with some 3,000,000,000 downloaded / had \$15,600,000,000 in revenue in the final quarter of 2009 / laptops (Apple introduced the first laptop of any company in 1991), iPods, and iPhones have each transformed their respective market. And when grouped as mobile communications devices, their revenues are higher than any other company in the field, i.e. Nokia, Samsung, etc. And now (Jan. 2010) the iPad, which they hope will transform all three markets at once. We'll see – but I would hesitate to bet against them.

On the other hand over 47 million Americans are living below the official poverty level, which was set when money was worth a lot more. E.g. a family of three earning more than \$17,180/yr is no longer considered to be living in poverty! Think about it – a generation ago one hour at a minimum wage job could buy you 8-10 gallons of gas. But now you'd need to earn over \$25/hr for the same purchasing power, and similar numbers are true for other staples. Some 35% of American families are living on under \$35,000/yr.

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
Good start though. NOTE: Watch the movie: "Lars and the Real Girl" if you haven't already.



I am being lenient - I could have sent you into the kitchen with the hungry cats.

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


I say "Cry havoc and let slip the mice of war!"

apologies to Mr Shakespeare.




We're going to have to review the instant replay film to see who actually won the cheese.

Too bad – they were such a lovely matched set. Isn't cloning great. It appears that their mirror neurons were working perfectly. Not now though!


mirror neurons - are neurons that fire both when an animal acts and when the animal observes the same action performed by another. Thus, the neuron "mirrors" the behavior of the other.


I wonder how it would have worked out, if he's turned around and tried to knock the cheese off with a quick swish of his powerful Moby Dick-like tail?

A nice thing about this gal is, that when I am fantasizing about other ones and call out their names in the heat of passion, she doesn't seem to mind.




I am starting to worry though - screw screw and no babies yet. This is so unmouse-like - the second part that is!

Within a couple of years, we had completely eliminated blame and criticism, such that neither one of us has said a critical word to the other in at least ten years. Pretty good, hunh?

In relationships, the art of loving yourself and your partner are equal challenges.

In the midst of an argument, for example, you find yourself feeling anything but loving toward your partner. And when you're blaming others, you're locked into fear and contraction. Strangely enough, though, those are the very moments when love is needed the most. In Stage Two of manifestation, barriers come up that need to be transcended. Old patterns like abandonment, guilt and the resonating memories of ancient wounds come forth to be welcomed into the light. At such times, love is not only the best healer. It's the only healer. Only love is big enough to welcome your fears into it. Love is big enough to handle everything. You can even love yourself for not being able to love yourself! Sounds odd maybe, but we've done it hundreds of times and it always works.

Here's the key insight:

Even the most troublesome patterns change when you love and accept them just the way they are.

And here's the key move:

When you notice something you want to change, first love and accept

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it just as it is.

What in you most needs to be loved? If you're in a close relationship now, what is it in your partner that you most need to love?
